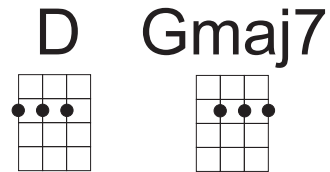
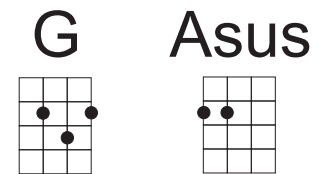
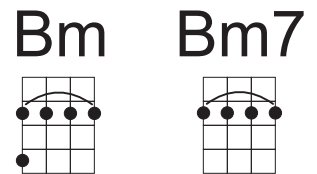


In The Bleak Mid-Winter

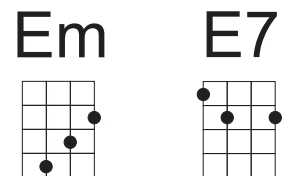
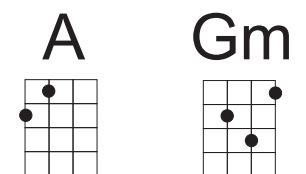
[D] In the bleak mid[Bm]winter,
