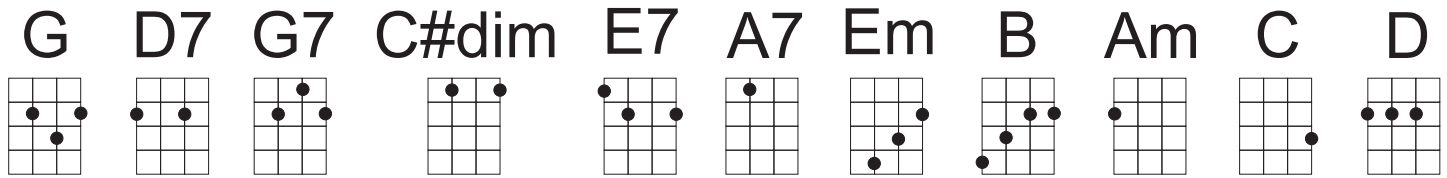


# When I'm Sixty-Four
